COURMAYEUR (AO) - ITALY**

September 1st – 3rd 2017

The Italian Ice Sport Federation FISG has the honour and pleasure to invite you to the Courmayeur Cup OPEN which will be held at the Courmayeur Forum Sport Center _ Courmayeur (AO) – Italy on September 1st – 3rd 2017. The competition will be organized in accordance with the 2016 regulations of the International Skating Union and the conditions included in this announcement.

Entries

Entries are restricted to invited National Teams whose skaters must have been born before July 1st 2003 (i.e. who have turned 14 before July 1st 2017).

Entries should be made on www.shorttrackonline.info; final entries closing on Sunday August 24th .

Italian skaters must also be entered on fisgonline; deadline is also Sunday August 24th .

Entry fee

An entry fee of Euro 30.00 must be paid for every athlete and for every coach; one coach per club/nation is exempted.

Track

The track is an artificial refrigerated indoor ice surface with the measures of 30x60 meters, boardless protective padding will be in place according to ISU communication no.1726. The standard track 111,12 meters to the lap with measured curves of 8,50 meters will have 7 markers used to establish the curve. The length of the straight is 28,85 m. Besides the original track there will be 4 tracks set to preserve good ice conditions. For all tracks one finish line will be used.

Conditions of Contest

The qualifying schedule on each distance shall be based on a knock-out system with Finals A and B (Friday session) and on the All-final system (Courmayeur Cup - Saturday and Sunday sessions).

Friday's session will see all athletes skate the three individual distances and the relay; the final classification on each distance of this session will determine the seeding for the first qualifying round of each distance of the Courmayeur Cup.

1500m (x2), 500m (x2), 1000m (x2)

3000m Relay (ladies) x 2, 5000m Relay (men) x 2

Award of Prizes

Prizes for the first, second and third classed in the overall classification for each individual category.

Qualification

- Make-up of the first qualifying round of each individual distance of the Friday session will be based on the skater's Distance World Ranking at the end of Season 2016/2017; athletes without a world ranking will be seeded according to their best times on each distance skated in season 2016/2017 or later.
- Make-up of the first qualifying round of each distance of the Courmayeur Cup will be based on the distance classification from Friday's session; each distance will be raced as an individual distance.
- Final results from each individual distance will be combined to determine an overall classification.

Medical assistance

Doctor and paramedical personnel will be present on competition days. An ambulance will be on standby on site in case of any emergency.

Medical Insurance

It is the sole responsibility of each Member to ensure or provide medical and accident insurance for their athletes. Proof of such may be requested by the Organizing Committee. See I.S.U. Rule 119.

Liability

In accordance with I.S.U. Rule 119, the Organizing Committee assumes no responsibility with respect to medical, bodily or personal injury or property loss or damage sustained or caused in connection with this competition.

Ice Training

Ice training will be available leading up to the competition at the Courmayeur Forum Sport Center at the cost of € 100 per hour (VAT included). If two or more teams agree to share one training session, both (all) of them can share the cost.
